(November 22, 2016)** – On Friday, December 16<sup>th</sup>, AMIKids Crossroads will hold its monthly Third Friday Drive-In in the vacant lot in downtown Punta Gorda, located between W. Marion Avenue and W. Retta Esplanade and US41 North and Taylor Street. Movie-goers are encouraged to bring toys for kids aged infant to 18 years, which will be donated to kids in care at Charlotte Behavioral Health Care (CBHC).

December's movie is the popular holiday family movie hit "Elf" staring Will Ferrell. Ferrell stars as Buddy, a normal-sized man raised as an elf at the North Pole. After wreaking havoc in the elf community and realizing that he's not a real Elf, Buddy travels to New York City, in full elf attire, to find his biological family. Buddy's adventures will bring laughter to the entire family.

"In the spirit of the holiday season, we decided to hold a toy drive at our December Drive-In," said John Davidson, Executive Director at AMIKids Crossroads. "The kids in care at CBHC are not only struggling with mental health disorders, but a lot of their families are also struggling financially – it's a dual disadvantage.
