Suggestions for boys include tools/tool kits, model cars/airplanes, sports supplies, and small gift cards to Wal-Mart or Target.

"We are so excited about our 3rd annual Toy & Gift Drive. Our first year, the FJTs raised 500 toys, and last year we raised 700. Our sites are set on surpassing last year's total. We hope while shopping for the holidays, you will make a donation to these children who face challenges on a daily basis. "The toy drive is being held in response to the urgent need of our struggling families," said Kelly Pomerville, CBHC Director of Marketing & PR, "Toy donations will alleviate pressure on families that would have had to choose between purchasing holiday gifts and necessary staples, such as food. We are so thankful that the FJTs have stood up to shine some holiday spirit into these kids' lives."

Last year over 103 families and 175 children received the toys collected. These toys alleviate pressure on families that would have had to choose between purchasing holiday gifts and necessary staples, such as food. The drive also brought in "extra toys" that were donated to Golisano Children's Hospital and

Children's Network of Southwest Florida. Children's Network of SWFL is the non-profit administer of the child welfare system in Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Hendry and Glades Counties. Children's Network is responsible for over 2,000 abused and neglected children, and delivers a comprehensive local system of care through subcontracts with more than 50 social service agencies (like CBHC).

Additional recipients include 20 adults and 15 children in the Crisis Stabilization Unit at CBHC.
